

Information regarding Article 13 of the Italian Privacy Act (Legislative Decree 196/2003)

We wish to inform you that the Legislative Decree no. 196 of 30 June 2003 (the Italian Privacy and Data Protection Act) provides for the protection of people in terms of the processing of their personal data.

In accordance with the Act your personal data will be processed according to the principles of propriety, lawfulness and transparency, and will safeguard your confidentiality and your rights.

According to Article 13 of Legislative Decree no. 196/2003, we hereby notify you as follows:

1. The data which you have provided will be processed with the sole and exclusive purpose of providing the service requested and the management of services available on the website (such as the report of information regarding displays and events, the participation in promotions, the sending of information or the communication of services, etc.).

2. Personal data will be processed using manual tools and through it and/or computerised systems, for the period of time which is strictly necessary in order to achieve the purposes for which the data was collected. Specific security measures will be observed in order to prevent the loss of data, illegal or improper use or access by unauthorised persons.

3. The provision of data is optional and refusal to provide personal data will incur no penalty.

4. The data will not be communicated to third parties, and it will not be the subject of circulation.

5. The owner of data processing rights is goodwill S.r.l., via Castiglione 41, 40124 Bologna.

6. goodwill S.r.l. will be responsible for the handling of data, through the website www.festivalartecontemporanea.it, where this information will be published for public consultation.

7. Types of data processing

a. Internet data

Data processing systems and software procedures used for the functioning of this website acquire, during their normal operation, several items of personal data, the transmission of which is implied in the use of internet communication protocols. This involves information which is not collected in order to be associated with identified interested parties, but which in terms of its nature could, through processing and associations with data possessed by third parties, enable the identification of the users. This category of data includes the IP addresses or domain names of the computers used by users who connect to the website, the URI (Uniform Resource Identifier) addresses of the requested resources, the time of request, the method used to submit the request to the server, the size of the file obtained as a response, the numerical code indicating the state of the response given by the server (successfully concluded, error, etc.) and other parameters relating to the operating system and the computer environment of the user. This data is used with the sole and exclusive purpose of obtaining anonymous statistical information about the use of the website and in order to verify its correct functioning, and they will be cancelled immediately after the processing. The data can be used for the verification of responsibility in the event of hypothetical computer crimes causing damage to the website. Except for this case, the data regarding web contacts will not continue for more than one solar year.

b. Data provided voluntarily by the user

The voluntary request by the user for registration on the website, by means of one of the forms available, requires the subsequent acquisition of all the data specified on the form, which are necessary for carrying out the registration itself and linking it to a username and password chosen by the applicant. The optional, unequivocal and voluntary sending of email using the forms available on this website may involve the subsequent acquisition of the email address of the sender, which is necessary to respond to requests, as well as any other personal data inserted into

the message. Specific summary information will be progressively reported or visualised in the pages of the website preset for particular services on request.

c. Cookies

Cookies are small amounts of data, memorised from web pages on the computer of the user. They will be used by the website www.festivalartecontemporanea.it in order to save access data for the reserved area of the website and will be automatically deleted when leaving this area. The cookies used in this website avoid the use of other computer techniques which could be potentially damaging for the confidentiality of the navigation of users and they do not enable the acquisition of personal data identifying the user. Cookies will not be used for the transmission of personal data, nor will any use whatsoever be made of so-called persistent cookies (which are permanently stored on the computer of the user), providing systems for the tracing of users.

At all times you may exercise your rights as far as the processing of your personal data is concerned, according to Article 7 of the Legislative Decree 196/2003, which is published here in full for your convenience.

Legislative Decree 196/2003, Article 7 – Rights of access to personal data and other rights.

1. The person concerned has the right to obtain confirmation of the existence or non-existence of personal data regarding his or her person, even if these have not yet been recorded, and to be informed of the fact in an intelligible manner.

2. The person concerned has the right to obtain information pertaining to:

- a) the provenance of personal data;
- b) processing purposes and methods;
- c) the applied logic in the instance of processing carried out using electronic means;
- d) the name and address of the owner, people in charge and designated representative in accordance with article 5, comma 2;
- e) the parties and categories of parties to whom the personal data may be conveyed or who may have knowledge of such data in view of their role as designated representative within the state of Italy, as person in charge or appointee.

3. The person concerned has the right to obtain:

- a) the revision, correction or where called for, integration of details;
- b) the deletion, transformation in anonymous form or the freezing of details which are processed unlawfully, including those not requiring storage in relation to the purposes for which the details were originally collected and processed;
- c) demonstration of the fact that the operations stated in points a) and b) have been brought to the attention, also with regards to contents, of those parties to whom the details have been passed on or conveyed, except in the event that such a fulfilment of duty should be impossible or should entail means which are clearly out of all proportion to the rights in question.

4. The person concerned has the right to object, totally or in part:

- a) for legitimate reasons, to the processing of his or her personal details, even though pertinent to the purpose of data collection;
- b) to the processing of his or her personal details for the purposes of receiving advertising or direct sales materials or for the completion of market research or information of a commercial nature.
